# Coronavirus / COVID-19 information and resources



- Providers and clinics are working hard to make sure you can get the care you need.
  This includes physical and mental health and substance use treatment. Most are setting up visits by telephone or video call. Some inperson appointments are still available.
- Preventive and chronic care is especially important. Clinics are prepared to serve you safely. Call your provider to learn how you can get care.
- Dental offices are open for urgent services. They are working on plans to provide safe, regular dental care. Contact your dental clinic to learn more.
- Symptoms of COVID-19 include fever, cough and shortness of breath.
- If you are feeling those symptoms, call your primary care provider's (PCP) office. If you are a Jackson Care Connect member and are not sure who your PCP is, check you



not sure who your PCP is, check your ID card or call customer service at 855-722-8208.

 All OHP members in Jackson County can now extend their prescriptions to 90 days.
Members can also get prescriptions by mail.
